News from Shudy Camps Parish Council

The Parish Council election window will have just closed when I submit this report. I am hoping we will reach the minimum of three candidates so we have a Parish council going forward. It would be even better if which reach the maximum of 5 candidates.

The parish council received the 6 free trees scheme from South Cambridgeshire District Council, we have planted them temporarily and when the Jubilee Green application is confirmed we are planning to plant them around the Green

The Jubilee Green application mentioned above is still to be approved, there were no objections during the public consultation period, the council are currently writing a report and hopefully by the next report we will have good news.

Some of the existing trees around Jubilee Green are getting a little out of hand and we are looking to solve this problem by removing them which should improve the area significantly. We are also looking at replacing some of the paving slabs on the Green, as the existing slabs are very uneven due to the roots from the trees. If anybody has any ideas for the green going forward please let us know.

It has come to our attention that there is a litter problem in Nosterfield End on the footpaths, the parish council is looking to install a new litter bin in the hope that people will use them.

The footpath which runs between the back of the Parkway and the Park which is notoriously damp has improved greatly with the addition of a new batch of chipping. The chippings were obtained via a resident's tree being felled and chipped. Therefore there was no charge to the parish and some of the local residents moved all the chippings by hand (by wheelbarrow to be precise). Thanks goes out to all those involved including councillor John Trehearn who organised everything.

At the committee meeting on 20 January, the new hall hire rates which took effect from 1 April 2026 were agreed. These increases are primarily due to increased cost of heating etc.

In a bid to improve energy efficiency, we have been trialling a new heating controller which allows the separate rooms to be heated to different temperatures and controlled via an app. We are experiencing some teething problems which we are hoping to resolve. Hopefully there will be less demand upon heating as we head towards the summer months.

Please also only use the rooms which you have booked; where additional rooms are used this increases costs such as heating and cleaning. We will be carrying out spot checks to monitor usage.

The annual parish meeting will be held in the Village Hall on Saturday 9th May.

The Connection

News from our Anglican Churches

Dear Friends,

Most of May this year is all Easter. We don't even reach the Pentecost until the 24th. Easter isn't just one day. The Easter season is as a whole 49 days long. It is the period between the Jesus' resurrection on Easter day and the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. 40 days into that period is the Ascension. St Luke tells us that in the time between his resurrection and ascension Jesus 'presented himself alive after his passion by many proofs appearing to them during 40 days and speaking of the kingdom of God'. We can see this time as Jesus preparing his disciples for the work they would do when they had received the power of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. This was the work of taking the New Life of the Resurrection out into the world; helping the spread of Gods Kingdom to all lands and all nations; making disciple of all nations; being witnesses to Jesus in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria and to the ends of the earth

All baptized Christians share in the new life of the resurrection. We are called to live this new life here and now; living in the light of God's word; fulfilling his commands; living according to the reality of God's Kingdom, and in so doing helping to bring about the words of the Lord's prayer – 'Thy Kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven'

A brief look at the newspaper or watching the news on TV show us that the world we live in is nowhere near the he Kingdom of God as yet. It is not the ideal world of love, peace and justice. We could say that although at the resurrection Jesus won the decisive victory over the devil, we still do not experience the final consequences of that victory. The devil still fights on even though he can never win.



Because the world is not the ideal of God's Kingdom as yet, trying to live as people who belong to God's kingdom is not made easy. We may be well aware of what the ideals we should be living are, but the imperfections of our world mean that we are unable to live out those ideals, merely chose from the least of several evils. For example, in God's Kingdom there is no war but in our imperfect world war can be a necessity. We know that lying is wrong, but who would not lie to save a person's life? Thou shalt not steal, but who would not steal the gun from a killer if they could? Those are extreme examples, but each of us every day has to make small compromises or unsatisfactory choices. We should though as Christians have firmly set in our mind the ideal of God's Kingdom to help us make those choices. We should make the choice that, however slight, move us in the direction of God's Kingdom, and not further away.

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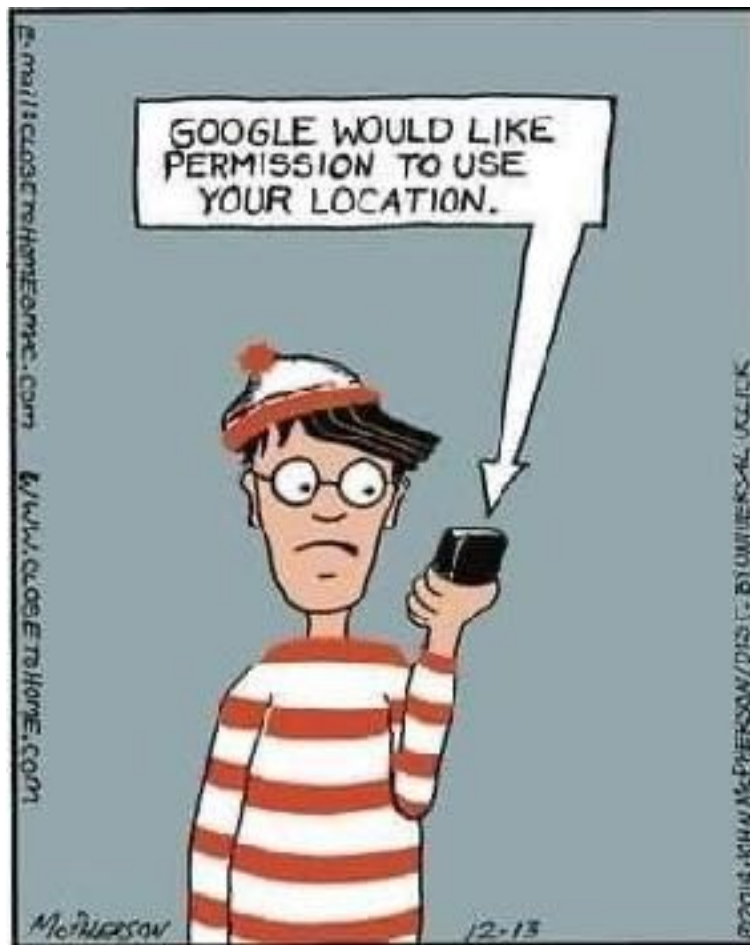

County & District Councillors Report

Cambridge Growth Company

You may recall from previous reports that the government have identified Cambridge as an area they see prime for growth, due to the boom of the science and tech sector in the Greater Cambridge area. The numbers of additional houses that the government think would be sufficient to support this economic growth still uncertain, with numbers around the 100,000 mark being mooted, although still unconfirmed.

To manage this growth, and to identify areas to build these new houses, the government have set up the Cambridge Growth Company, which will end up morphing into the Development Corporation (DevCo). A lot of the detail of how this will be set up is still unclear, but from correspondence with the relevant government minister, it would seem that this DevCo would ultimately take planning powers away from the local authorities for the larger 'strategic sites'. The point has been made that to disrupt one of the highest achieving planning services in the country could be hugely damaging to the local landscape. This point may have fallen on deaf ears, but we will see.

Food Waste Collection

You may recall from previous reports that due to a change in the law by DEFRA (the government department for environment & food), all local authorities will have to collect food waste separately from other green waste, starting this year. This means we will all get a new separate food caddy in the coming months that all food waste must be disposed into. This will then be collected every week alongside the usual bin. For most of us this is on Wednesday.

We are expecting the new caddies to reach us by September-time, as the rollout is across the Greater Cambridge area, with our area one of the last to receive them.

Electric Vehicle Cable Channel Trial

The County Council are embarking on a trial in an attempt to help people that have electric vehicles but no driveway to park and charge them on.

The trial will offer up to a certain number of people in our district the chance to apply for a channel, which runs from their charger within their property, across the pavement, and connect to their vehicle. It's made clear that the homeowner will need their own charging system, all the trial provides is the channel to cross the pavement. There are some costs involved, depending on your personal circumstances.

County & District Councillors Report

Oil Fund

The council has received £708,000 from the Government which is ring-fenced to support households struggling with the cost of domestic oil heating. The money has been added to the council's Crisis & Resilience Fund, and applications are being administered by the Cambridgeshire Community Foundation.

Applications to the fund opened on Monday 30 March. The link to apply is at:

This fund is intended for Cambridgeshire households on low incomes who are reliant on heating oil and who need to top up their tanks as a matter of urgency. To receive this support, applicants must meet all the following criteria:

- Live in Cambridgeshire.
- Be reliant on heating oil to heat their home and/or water.
- Have 150 litres or less of oil remaining at the time of application.
- Be in receipt of or eligible for one of the following means-tested benefits:
 - Universal Credit
 - Pension Credit
 - Income based Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)

Life Skills

The County Council's Skills team are offering a number of classes called life skills. These are designed to help people pick up a variety of new skills that could help with day-to-day life. Most of these classes could be fully funded, depending on an individual's circumstance.

We must find long-term, sustainable funding for hospice care on a national basis. We do not want to be in this same position in a years' time. The future is still uncertain, and the ending of this service would, without doubt, have huge implications for our local community and must be protected at all costs. This is a welcome but temporary reprieve until March 2027, so our work doesn't stop here. Over the coming months we will continue to explore new sustainable funding opportunities and plan for increased fundraising needs. Our next step is to look at different service models and how these could be funded, accepting that unfortunately there are no guarantees this will be possible. Our thanks, as always, go to our supporters and our outstanding team of staff and volunteers who continue to care and support each family who come through our doors. 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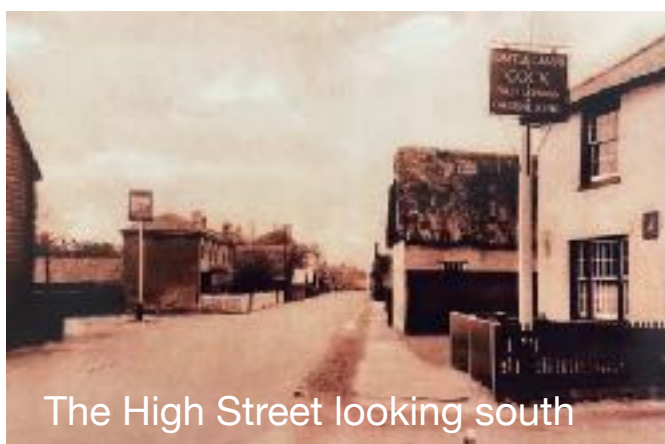

The Hundred Parishes Society

The Romans introduced wine making to the UK and vines were cultivated to some extent until World War I when land was needed for growing food.

Viticulture (the process of growing grapes) began to revive in the 1970s with warmer summers and the development of grape varieties suited to English conditions. Today, we have several successful vineyards in The Hundred Parishes.

One of the first was Chilford Hall in Linton parish. It was run by the Alper family for 50 years before changing hands in 2024. The new owners continue to manage the 20-acre vineyard alongside their Grillo Outdoor Kitchen business.

In Great Bardfield, Great Lodge produces its own wines from six different grape varieties. The vineyard is open to visitors midweek from May to September and there is also a wedding venue on site. Website: <https://www.greatlodge.co.uk/vineyard/>



Hazel End vineyard, Farnham in June

In Farnham, Hazel End Farm has been growing grapes for over thirty years. Their sparkling white wine is sold as Three Squirrels. This celebrates the fact that the Gosling family who own the land once had a bank in Fleet Street where a sign above the door read “Ye Three Squirrels”. Website: <https://www.corylet.com/>

Gunyah vineyard, Stansted Mountfitchet in September

In Saffron Walden, the first vines were planted at Saffron Grange in 2008. The family business is now well established, producing white sparkling wines and offering vineyard tours for small groups from mid-April. Website: <https://www.saffrongrange.com/>

In Stansted Mountfitchet, a new vineyard was planted in 2021 on a south-facing slope. The first grapes were harvested in 2023 and wine from the Gunyah Vineyard is now on sale.
